AYMAN ISMAIL

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Ayman Ismail is and international expert in entrepreneurship and economic development. He is the Abdul Latif Jameel Endowed Chair of Entrepreneurship and Associate Professor at the American University in Cairo School of Business and the founding director of the AUC Venture Lab, AUC Angels and AUC Innovation Hub.

Education: Dr. Ismail is a former Research Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School. He received his PhD in International Economic Development from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), where his research focused on entrepreneurial finance in the MENA region. He also holds a bachelor's degree in engineering and an MBA from the American University in Cairo, and a master's degree in city planning and geographic information systems from MIT. He has also completed executive education programs at Harvard Kennedy School, Oxford University and Georgetown University.

Academia: His areas of research and expertise focus on entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial finance in emerging markets; entrepreneurship and innovation policy; and economic development in the MENA region. He is the lead author of the Global Entrepreneurship Monitor (GEM) reports on Egypt and the MENA region. GEM is the largest global study of entrepreneurship conducted annually to assess entrepreneurial activities, aspirations and attitudes of individuals across more than 100 countries. He has designed several entrepreneurship education programs in the region and has introduced the first Arabic language Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on entrepreneurship, with more than 50,000 students. He is also active in Executive Education for corporate and open enrollment programs targeting senior executives on issues of strategic and entrepreneurial management.

As the Founding Director of the AUC Venture Lab, Dr. Ismail led its vision and operations over the past 8 years. Today, AUC Venture Lab has accelerated more than 250 startups, collectively raising more than EGP 3 billion in investments, and creating more than 8,000 jobs. AUC Venture Lab also established the first FinTech acceleration program in the region. Through partnerships with corporations such as the CIB, AAIB, Mastercard, SODIC, GE, Nestle, Mountain View and Shell, and international organizations such as the World Bank/IFC, Drosos and Oxfam, the Lab provides capacity building, training, mentorship, seed funding and a co-working space on campus for startups. AUC Venture Lab was recognized as a high impact/top university business incubator in Africa and MENA (2014, 2015, 2018 and 2019/2020) by UBI Index.

Previously (2011-14), he led the School's Entrepreneurship and Innovation Program (EIP), which contributed to the creation of an entrepreneurship ecosystem at AUC and Egypt and created more than 40 community partnerships and impacted more than 6,000 young entrepreneurs.

Professional: Dr. Ismail has a broad multidisciplinary experience in entrepreneurship, economic development, business strategy and technology based on professional practice and academic research. Previously, he was a co-founder and Managing Partner at Enovio Consulting, a US-based management & strategy consulting firm. Prior to that, he was a consultant in McKinsey & Company's Business Technology Office based in New York. He has advised senior management in leading Fortune 100 companies, fast-growing startups, government agencies, and non-profits on key organization, operations and technology issues. He has also consulted and conducted research for international organizations such as the World Bank, IFC, UNDP, African Development Bank, UNCTAD, USAID, GIZ, as well as multiple US government agencies.

Entrepreneurship: Dr. Ismail is a co-founder, angel investor or board member of several fast-growing startups, including: PayMob Solutions (fintech – acceptance and mobile payment infrastructure), Ready-to-Ship R2S (e-commerce logistics), Klickit (fintech – education sector payments), and Tamweely (microfinance). He is a member of board of directors and investment committee for CVentures, the corporate venture capital fund of CIB Bank. He has mentored and supported many entrepreneurs and social entrepreneurs through AUC Venture Lab, Nahdet el Mahrousa, Endeavor and other support organizations. He is a member of the global advisory board for the Babson Collaborative for Entrepreneurship Education.

Recognitions: In 2012, Dr. Ismail was selected as a Young Global Leader (YGL) by the World Economic Forum (WEF).
